

Historic South Downtown Board of Directors Strategic Planning 2024 Priorities Development Map

The following issue map is intended to guide Historic South Downtown Board of Directors in identifying community-wide shared priorities based on past, persistently expressed needs and current strategic plans and vision documents. The X Access Categories are summaries only. The priorities identified by our sources may fit in one or more of these X Access Categories. The priorities captured below are draw from:

- 2019 South Downtown Neighborhood Priorities: a meta study of public outreach reports dating from at least 1998, distilling the repeated community priorities. This report documented the ongoing, persistent, and recurring needs of Pioneer Square and Chinatown International District. - CID Vision Group Draft 10-Year Vision Action Plan, an effort to translate the Vision Group's 10 Year Vision into an implementation plan. - Alliance for Pioneer Square's 2025 Strategic Plan, which seeks to guide our partner organization to serve the myriad stakeholders and needs of the neighborhood and make certain all feel welcome and all voices are heard.
